<i>At the Police Court, on Wednesday morning the Chairman (Mr W. H. Yeomans) referred to the death of the Queen, saying they met under circumstances of great depression and sorrow. – January 1901</i>	23

<i>At the churches here on Sunday special reference was made to the late Queen. A memorial service was held at the parish church and the Rev. Canon Newton alluded to the sad event. Memorial services were also held at Bates Hill, Wesleyan Chapel, the United Methodist Free Church, and also at the Wesleyan Chapel, Headless Cross. – February 1901</i>	23
<i>Three memorial services were held in the town and were largely attended. - 1901</i>	24
<i>When Prince George arrived today at Crabbs Cross, to inspect a small holdings and allotments scheme for the unemployed he had a pleasant surprise. - 1934</i>	25
